True Faith and Phony Faith that Does Not Save Acts 8:9-25

Introducing people to Christ without sharing the secret of Christian growth and victory is like recruiting a soldier and sending him into battle without training and without a weapon. The moment a person becomes a believer, he or she is free of one set of problems but inherits another. A Christian must now face living the new life in an evil and tempting world. For that we need the power of the presence of Jesus Christ; the Holy Spirit. Very often, people make a profession of faith because they are looking for a quick fix to their problems. But there is a difference between just believing in Christ and genuinely surrendering to Christ. **Acts 8:9-25** gives us a perfect example in the account of a man named Simon.

The Sorcerer's Profession of Faith

⁹ But there was a certain man called Simon, who previously practiced sorcery in the city and astonished the people of Samaria, claiming that he was someone great, ¹⁰ to whom they all gave heed, from the least to the greatest, saying, "This man is the great power of God." ¹¹ And they heeded him because he had astonished them with his sorceries for a long time. ¹² But when they believed Philip as he preached the things concerning the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, both men and women were baptized. ¹³ Then Simon himself also believed; and when he was baptized, he continued with Philip, and was amazed, seeing the miracles and signs which were done.

The Sorcerer's Sin

¹⁴ Now when the apostles who were at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, ¹⁵ who, when they had come down, prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit. ¹⁶ For as yet He had fallen upon none of them. They had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ¹⁷ Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit. ¹⁸ And when Simon saw that through the laying on of the apostles' hands the Holy Spirit was given, he offered them money, ¹⁹ saying, "Give me this power also, that anyone on whom I lay hands may receive the Holy Spirit." ²⁰ But Peter said to him, "Your money perish with you, because you thought that the gift of God could be purchased with money! ²¹ You have neither part nor portion in this matter, for your heart is not right in the sight of God. ²² Repent therefore of this your wickedness, and pray God if perhaps the thought of your heart may be forgiven you. ²³ For I see that you are poisoned by bitterness and bound by iniquity." ²⁴ Then Simon answered and said, "Pray to the Lord for me, that none of the things which you have spoken may come upon me." ²⁵ So when they had testified and preached the word of the Lord, they returned to Jerusalem, preaching the gospel in many villages of the Samaritans.

- 2. Read Acts 8:14-17. Why did the Peter and John go to Samaria?
- 3. How did Simon respond to the gospel message of salvation after Peter and John came to Samaria?
- 4. **Read Acts 8:18-19.** What distinguished him from the other believers?
- 5. **Read Acts 8:20-24**. What was Peter's response to Simon's offer? What was Simon's response to Peter?
- 6. Why do you think Simon was "full of bitterness" about what was happening in Samaria? Why is this such a dangerous sin? Have you ever felt the same way?
- 7. Does Simon heed Peter's warning and repent (vs. 24)?
