'THE REALLY GOOD LIFE'

(Life of Christ Series)
Luke 12

Review: To be someone that God can abundantly bless, you must 'unleaven your life' and become less vulnerable to 'hypocrisy' (Luke 12:1-12). Leaven is to your soul and spirit, what yeast is to bread dough – fungi is injected, permeates and ferments the dough (human heart) causing its host to enlarge and change form. In Scripture, leaven is almost always used as a very negative influence that unfavorably alters a person's mind, soul and spirit. If the spiritual leaven of either worldly

attraction or religious self-righteousness is allowed in the heart, mind and soul, hypocrisy will result. Hypocrisy (literally 'behind or under a mask') is faking it on the outside to fool others into thinking you are someone other than who you really are inside. Hypocrisy moves a person out and away from the position of blessability from God. If a person dies as a hypocrite in God's view, he or she will be eternally forbidden entry into heaven, the ultimate position of blessability (Matthew 24:45-51). The infection of leaven quarantines its carrier from heaven.

The committed follower of the Lord Jesus Christ cannot stand a duplications lifestyle (in himself or others) and will earnestly seek to be blessable by being righteous on the outside and the inside. Disciples must remain as aloof as possible from the world and pretentious religion to avoid being spiritually-leavened by their influence. The Problem

The Folly of Possessions Lesson

(The Curing Influence of Learning Scripture)

The Principle

"And He said to them, "Take heed and <u>beware of covetousness</u>, for one's <u>life does not consist in the abundance</u> <u>of the things he possesses."</u>

Avarice deceives you about what's important Avarice turns blessings into 'self-idolatry' Avarice robs you of God's purpose for living Avarice makes you a servant rather than a steward

"You shall not covet your neighbor's wife; and you shall not desire your neighbor's house, his field, his male servant, his female servant, his ox, his donkey, or anything that is your neighbors."

Deuteronomy 5:21/ an expansion of **Exodus 20:17**

"Do not be deceived. Neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor homosexuals, nor sodomites, nor thieves, <u>nor covetous</u>, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners will inherit the kingdom of God."

The Foolish Farmer Parable

(The 'Constrictor' Influence of a 'Stuffed Soul')

The Parable

"Then He spoke a parable to them, saying, "The ground of a certain rich man yielded plentifully. And he thought within himself, saying, 'What shall I do, since I have no room to store my crops?' So he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build greater, and there I will store all my crops and my goods. And I will say to my soul, "Soul, you have many goods laid up for many years; take your ease; eat, drink, and be merry."' But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul will be required of you; then whose will those things be which you have provided?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God."
